With the objective of supporting multilingualism in India, CLIL@India is a project designed to set up a network of activities aimed at the transfer of CLIL knowledge/know-how and adaptation of European-based practice to the Indian education context. The project involves a Consortium of Higher Education institutions in India and Europe.

This conference aims to give visibility to the project which is at the beginning of its third and last year. The conference will give the Indian partners the opportunity to present the interim results of the CLIL teacher training and implementation they have carried out in selected primary schools.

An additional aim of the conference is to facilitate the exchange of CLIL experiences and showcase examples of action research projects in Europe.
